For telephone interviews (if administered), the interviewer's rating of the respondent's health will occur at the end of the interview to allow for a comparison to this circumstance in which interviewers are not able to observe physical cues. Incorporating the interviewer's assessment of the respondent's health might be a cost-effective measure of health to include in surveys and is consistent with the increasing use of interviewer observations in survey research. This experiment seeks to delineate what factors contribute to interviewers' assessments of respondents' health.
