SINGLE USE PLASTICS

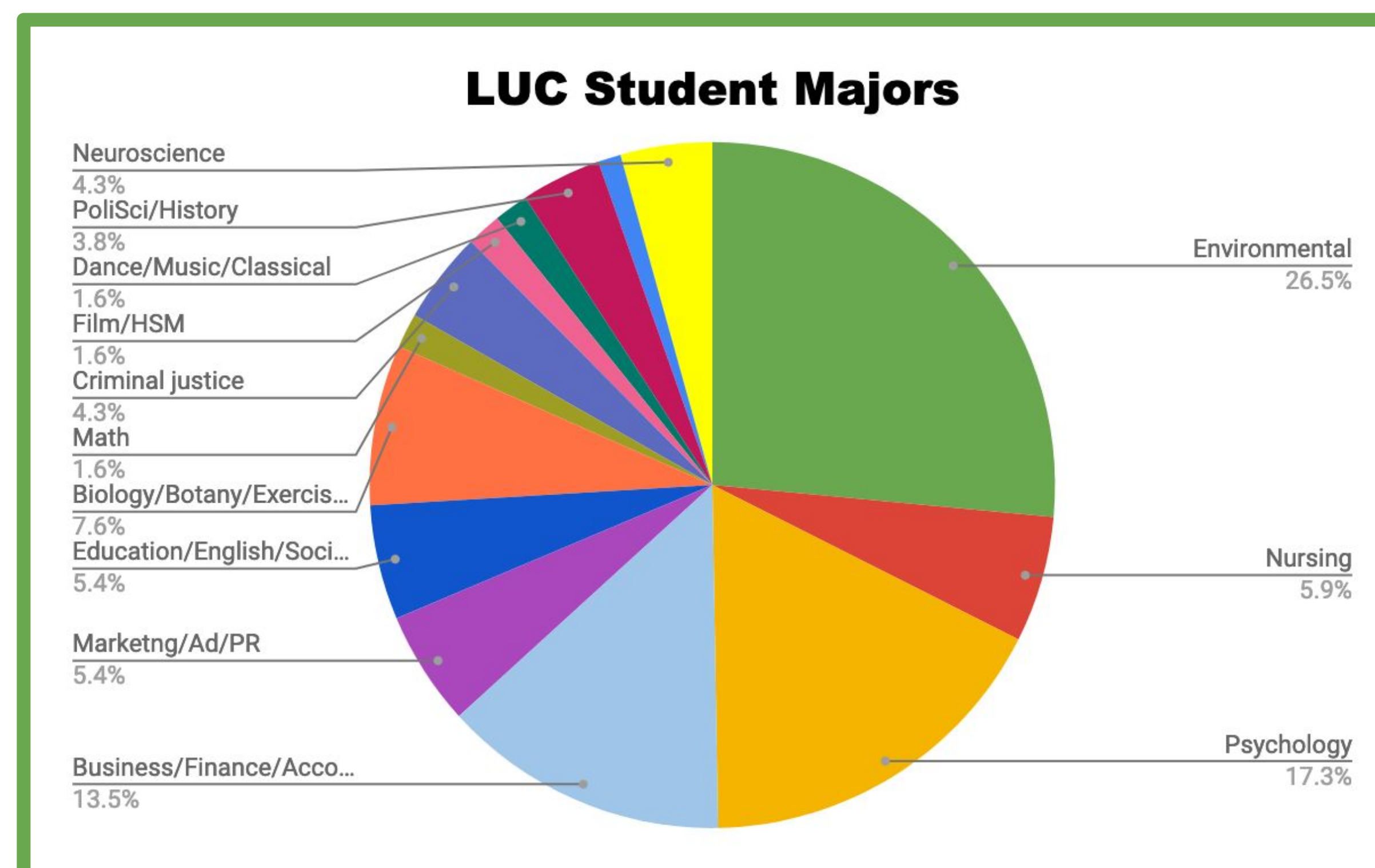
***No plastics are safe!**

SURVEY RESULTS

These are some results out of the 273 people surveyed, 96% being LUC students from diverse majors.



72% Want to see less single-use plastic on campus

77% would be willing to pay + \$1 in tuition per semester for sustainable practices
