

A historian of the religions of Late Antiquity, Madeleine Scopello is a specialist in Gnosticism and Manichaeism. Her research also focuses on intertestamental and mystical Jewish literature, patristic texts, Christian apocrypha and religious polemic literature. In 2006, she organized the first international colloquium on the Coptic Gospel of Judas. She also coorganized "The Forces of Good and Evil in the First Centuries of the Church" with B. Pouderon and Y.M. Blanchard. In 2014, she organized the international colloquium "Women in Western and Eastern Manicheism." She is Director of Research at the CNRS and Director of Studies at the École Pratique des Hautes Études. She also teaches at the Institut Catholique de Paris.
