Dietmar Mieth is one of the most renowned of German theological ethicists whose work ranges from Meister Eckhart, Narrative Ethics, Social Ethics to Bioethics. He is professor emeritus of Theological Ethics/Social Ethics at the University of Tuebingen and currently Fellow at the Max Weber College of Cultural and Social Studies in Erfurt, Germany.

In 1989, Dr. Mieth founded the International Center for Ethics in Tuebingen, one of the most important ethics centers in Germany. He has been a member of several major international and national ethics committees on Bioethics, for many years served as director on the international journal *Concilium*, and currently is the president of the Meister Eckhart Society. In his lecture, Mieth will re-examine the role of experience in and for ethics, a topic he has addressed in a two-volume book titled “Moral und Erfahrung”.
