Undocumented Students

Undocumented Americans continue to face immigration enforcement and xenophobia in light of the COVID-19 outbreak making it increasingly difficult to access resources and care. Those who have been detained are physically unable to practice social distancing or proper hygiene, forcefully putting them at a higher risk for contracting COVID-19. Additionally, Congress has left undocumented students and families out the new bill for Coronavirus aid and relief, even though this population will experience the brunt of the pandemic and work many front line jobs.
