Biographical History

Carol Moseley was born on August 16, 1947, in Chicago, IL to Joseph and Edna Moseley and attended the University of Illinois in Urbana-Champaign 1964-1965. Discontented with college life, she did not return to school after the first year and instead worked as a community representative at the Chicago Housing Authority. She eventually completed her degree at the University of Illinois Chicago, graduating with a BA in Political Science in 1969 and later studied at the University of Chicago's Law School, graduating in 1972. She helped found and served as president of the country's first Black Law Students Association.

After law school, Carol married classmate Michael Braun. Moseley Braun gave birth to her son, Matthew Braun in 1977. The marriage ended in 1986. Moseley Braun worked briefly in private practice before becoming the prosecutor in the Office of the U.S. Attorney from 1973 until 1977. In 1975, she won the Attorney General's Special Achievement Award for her work in civil litigation. She was elected to the Illinois House of Representatives in 1978, where she served for a decade. In 1988, she was elected Recorder of Deeds for Cook County, IL, a position she held for four years. She was the first African American elected to a Cook County executive position. Moseley Braun made reforms to the office including phasing out the Torrens system of recording, instituting a code of ethics, and contracting for a new computer system.

Following the Clarence Thomas confirmation hearings, Moseley Braun decided to enter the race for the U.S. Senate in November 1991. She defeated the Democratic incumbent and the Republican candidate and was elected in 1992, becoming the first African American woman ever elected to the U.S. Senate, the first woman to defeat an incumbent U.S. Senator in an election, and the first female Senator from Illinois. Moseley Braun was one of five women elected to the Senate that year, leading to some labeling 1992 as "The Year of the Woman." She was the only African American in the Senate for her entire term.

As a U.S. Senator, Moseley Braun was the first woman to serve as a permanent member of the Senate Finance Committee and served on the Subcommittee for International Trade. She also was a member of the Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs Committee, the Judiciary Committee, the Committee on Small Business, Committee on Aging, and the Bipartisan Commission on Taxes and Entitlements. She sponsored and co-sponsored bills for school construction, women's pension equity, transportation subsidy, the North American Free Trade Agreement, and the Balanced Budget Constitutional Amendment, among others.

A notable chapter of Braun's Senate career occurred on July 22, 1993, when she argued for the defeat of a patent renewal for the United Daughters of the Confederacy (UDC) to continue using the Confederate flag in their logo. Going against the influential Republican Senator Jesse Helms, who introduced the amendment, Braun gave an impassioned speech before the Senate and convinced 28 senators to change their vote. At the end of the three-hour debate in which Braun expressed the painful, racial symbolism of the Confederate flag, the Senate decided in a vote of 75 to 25 not to renew the UDC's patent.

Moseley Braun faced scrutiny during her Senate career when she was investigated for misused campaign money in 1993, and a Medicaid fraud case associated with her mother. In 1998, Moseley Braun ran for reelection, but a campaign damaged by allegations of mismanaged campaign funds and other controversies led to a loss. After her term as Senator ended, Moseley Braun was appointed by President Bill Clinton to serve as the U.S. Ambassador to New Zealand and Samoa, a position in which she served until 2001.

Moseley Braun sought other political offices at the national and local level in the early aughts and 2010s. She announced her intention to run for the 2004 Democratic Party presidential nomination in February 2003 and officially launched her candidacy in September of the same year. After disappointing primary numbers, she ended her campaign in January 2004 and backed Howard Dean's candidacy for the nomination. Moseley Braun also campaigned to be Mayor of Chicago but lost the 2011 election to Rahm Emmanuel.

Outside of politics, in 2005, Moseley Braun founded the organic and biodynamics food company, Ambassador Organics, selling tea, coffee, and other goods grown with organic and environmentally sustainable practices. She officially launched the company at the Organic Trade Association Show in May 2006. Along with starting her own business after her presidential campaign, Moseley Braun maintained a business law practice and business consultancy firm in Chicago. She served on the boards of North Carolina Mutual Life insurance, MWH Global, Inc, Michael Fields Agricultural Institute, the DuSable Museum, and other organizations.

Moseley Braun's memoir, *Trailblazer: Perseverance in Life and Politics*, was published in June 2025.

Scope and Content

The Carol Moseley Braun Papers contain over 100 linear feet of materials spanning the years 1988-2011. The collection includes papers pertaining to Moseley Braun's litigations, audiovisual materials, correspondence, handwritten letters and notes, floppy disks, textiles, newspaper clippings, memorabilia, photographs, negatives, awards, books, reports, and calendars. Materials cover Moseley Braun's time as Recorder of Deeds, U.S. Senator, Ambassador to New Zealand, professions outside politics, and her personal life.

Series 1: Senate, 1991-2016, Box 1-12, 68

This series contains materials relating to Moseley Braun's term as a United States Senator from 1993-1999 and her campaigns. Materials are arranged chronologically within each subseries.

Sub-series 1.1: 1992 Election Campaign, 1991-1992, Box 1

Includes speech drafts, press, correspondence, and polling information.

Subseries 1.2: 1998 Reelection Campaign, 1992-1999, Box 1-4, 68

Includes materials related to numerous events. Also includes research and reference materials, correspondence, and donation information.

Subseries 1.3: General, 1991-2016, undated, Box 4-9

Includes materials related to Moseley Braun's Senate activities and operation of her office, such as administrative files, schedules and events, contacts, correspondence, speeches, oral history interviews, and stationery.

Subseries 1.4: Reference Materials, 1981-1999, Box 9-11

Includes manuals, briefing books, and other reference materials related to the U.S. Senate as well as regarding specific topics like healthcare and education. Contains one 3.5" floppy disk.

Subseries 1.5: Press, 1989-1999, Box 11-12

Includes press coverage in newspapers and magazines, as well as contacts and correspondence.

Series 2: Ambassadorship, 1990-2008, Box, 17B-20, 22-38

Contains materials relating to Carol Moseley Braun's time as the U.S. Ambassador to New Zealand and Samoa in 2000-2001, including calendars, schedules, correspondences, handbooks, meeting minutes, and press.

Subseries 2.1: Administrative, 1990-2008, undated, Box 17B-20, 22

Includes materials related to embassy operations such as reports, correspondence, manuals, contacts, reports, and reference materials related to the operations of the embassy and Moseley Braun's transition into the role. Folders are arranged alphabetically, and the subseries contains one photograph and 3.5" floppy disk

Subseries 2.2: Appointment and Reference Materials, 1993-2003, undated, Box 22-26

This subseries documents the process for Moseley Braun's confirmation as ambassador, including the unusually long duration of her confirmation hearing and the rally of support she received for her confirmation. Materials also cover her time in New Zealand and departure from the position. Contains

applications and questionnaires, reference materials, interview transcripts, press releases, news clippings, and correspondence. Folders are arranged alphabetically, and the subseries includes one CD.

Subseries 2.3: Correspondence, 1996-2005, Box 26-32

This subseries contains most of the correspondence to and from Moseley Braun between 2000 and 2001. Other correspondence from this time period may be found in Series 5: Professional or Series 7: Correspondence. Materials are arranged chronologically.

Subseries 2.4: Embassy Activities, 2000-2001, Box 32-33

Includes administrative files, reports, meeting notes, memos, agendas and updates from meetings of the Country Team (all top Embassy staff) and committees. It also contains weekly status reports and notices from the embassy and related government offices. Folders are arranged alphabetically

Subseries 2.5: Press, 1998-2001, Box 33-34

Includes newspaper and magazine articles, as well as correspondence with media outlets. Folders are arranged chronologically.

Subseries 2.6: Residence and Guests, 1999-2002, Box 34

Includes correspondence, itineraries, and event guest lists, as well as materials related to the maintenance of the residence and visitors. General information is listed first, then alphabetically by individuals.

Subseries 2.7: Schedule and Events, 1999-2001, Box 34-38

Includes mostly invitations, guest lists, travel information, and calendars. Also included are several folders related to the United States Antarctic program and Moseley Braun's trip to Antarctica in 2000. Folders are arranged chronologically.

Subseries 2.8: Speeches, 1999-2001, Box 38

Includes speeches given by Moseley Braun and related event materials. Items are arranged chronologically.

Series 3: Presidential Campaign, 1981-2011, Box 21, 38-67, 69

This series contains materials related to Carol Moseley Braun's presidential campaign for the 2004 election. Includes research on national and state issues, speeches, correspondence, staff memos/notes, and reference materials. Other materials include press, Carol for President stationery, schedules, events, and other miscellaneous media.

Subseries 3.1: General, 1995-2006, Box 38-40

Includes administrative files, Carol for President stationery, staff memos/notes, endorsements, and reference materials. Also contains some information on CDs and 3.5" floppy disk. Folders are arranged chronologically

Subseries 3.2: Correspondence, 1996-2011, Box 40-42

Contains the majority of the correspondence to and from Moseley Braun between 2002-2004. Although this subseries is divided into letters to Moseley Braun, letters from Moseley Braun, and general correspondence, if it was a sustained conversation that was stapled together, some letters from Moseley Braun can be found under the category of correspondence to Moseley Braun.

Sub-subseries 3.2.1: Correspondence to Moseley Braun, 2003-2011, Box 40-41

Includes letters written to Moseley Braun. If it was a sustained conversation that was stapled together, some letters from Moseley Braun. Items arranged alphabetically by individual, with general correspondence arranged chronologically at the end. Contains one CD.

Sub-subseries 3.2.2: Correspondence from Moseley Braun, 1996-2004, undated, Box 41

Includes letters written by Moseley Braun. Items arranged alphabetically by individual recipient, with general correspondence last.

Sub-subseries 3.2.3: General, 2003-2004, undated, Box 41-42

Includes email correspondence and form letters arranged chronologically. Some material is saved on a 3.5" floppy disk.

Subseries 3.3: Events and Fundraising, 2002-2011, undated, Box 21, 42-47, 69

Includes invitations, schedules, event details, fundraising information, donor communications, and related materials. Contains one 3.5" floppy disk and folders are arranged chronologically. Additional event information can also be found in Subseries 3.8: Speeches, Statements, and Writings.

Subseries 3.4: Platforms and Debate Preparation, 2003-2004, undated Box 47-48

Contains information on a variety topics and related talking points used for debates and other speaking engagements during the campaign. Includes one 3.5" floppy disk, and materials are arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 3.5: Press, 2001-2004, Box 21, 48-49

Includes various press materials related to Moseley Braun and the other presidential candidates including newspaper articles, magazines, interview materials, and some correspondence with the press. Contains one CD, and folders are arranged chronologically

Subseries 3.6: Research and Reference Material, 1981-2004, Box 49-61

Contains materials related specifically to research on current events, state-level and national issues, Moseley Braun's opponents, election data, and the process of running a presidential campaign. Also contains research on Moseley Braun's life and career. Includes a CD and 3.5" floppy disk. Folders are arranged alphabetically by topic, then alphabetically by state.

Subseries 3.7: Special Interest Groups, 1999-2004, Box 61-65

Includes booklets, reports, and correspondence addressed to Moseley Braun from special interest groups and organizations. Various media includes CD, 3.5" floppy disk, and a photograph. Folders are arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 3.8: Speeches, Statements, and Writings, 2000-2004, undated Box 65-66

Includes speeches, press statements, and writings by Moseley Braun. Materials are arranged chronologically, and the subseries also contains 3.5" floppy disks.

Subseries 3.9: Campaigning for Other Candidates, 2003-2004, Box 66-67

Contains schedules and events, promotional material, and press related to Moseley Braun's support for other Democratic presidential candidates after she withdrew from the race. Materials include photographs and are arranged alphabetically

Series 4: Mayoral Campaign, 2002-2011, undated, Box 67-74

Contains materials related to Moseley Braun's campaign to become Mayor of Chicago. Items are split into multiple subseries including administrative, correspondence and contacts, events and fundraising, platforms and reference material, press, special interest groups, and speeches.

Subseries 4.1: Administrative, 2010-2011, Box 67

Includes Carol for Chicago letterhead, advertisements, office/staffing files, and reference materials. Folders are arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 4.2: Correspondence and Contacts, 2009-2011, undated, Box 67-68

Contains business cards, letter drafts, contact information, and the majority of the correspondence to and from Moseley Braun between 2010 and 2011. Other correspondence from this time period may be found in Series 5: Professional or Series 7: Correspondence. Materials are arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 4.3: Events and Fundraising, 2004-2011, undated, Box 68-71

Includes schedules, event details, fundraising information, donor communications, and related materials. Items are arranged chronologically.

Subseries 4.4: Platforms and Reference Materials, 2002-2011, undated, Box 71-73

Contains reference materials on a variety of topics such as public safety, economic development, Chicago statistics, and more. Materials are arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 4.5: Press, 2010-2011, Box 73

Includes press releases and press coverage of Moseley Braun's campaign.

Subseries 4.6: Special Interest Groups, 2010-2011, Box 73-74

Contains questionnaires for the mayoral candidates and information about special interest groups and organizations. Folders are arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 4.7: Speeches, 2010-2011, undated, Box 74

Includes speeches, talking points, and partial speeches given by Moseley Braun.

Series 5: Professional, 1973-2018, undated, Box 74-90, 93

Contains materials and documents related to Moseley Braun's professional work outside of her prominent political career.

Subseries 5.1: Career and Business, 1973-2018, undated, Box 74-79

Includes information on Moseley Braun's organics business, her tenure as a locally elected official, some employment as an attorney, and her work with GoodWorks International.

Sub-subseries 5.1.1: Good Food Organics, 2002-2018, undated, Box 74-77

Contains materials related to the businesses started by Moseley Braun, Good Food Organics and Ambassador Organics. Materials include business plans, operations manual, research materials, marketing materials, coffee roasting logs, financial documents, business memberships, photographs, and certifications. Folders are arranged alphabetically.

Sub-subseries 5.1.2: Other Careers, 1973, 1995-2011, Box 78-79

The bulk of materials relate to Moseley Braun's work with GoodWorks International, a global policy and strategy consulting firm. Also includes items related to her time teaching in higher education, law career, and biographical information. Contains 3.5" floppy disks, and folders are arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 5.2: General, 1980-2009, undated, Box 79-82, 93

Includes address books, contacts, directories, press, and information about various special interest groups and projects. Contains 3.5" floppy disks, and folders are arranged alphabetically.

Series 5.3: Local Politics, 1978-2000, Box 82-83

Bulk of materials related to Moseley Braun's time as a member of the Illinois House of Representatives (1979-1988) and as Cook County Recorder of Deeds (1988-1992). Folders are arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 5.4: Schedules and Events, 1973-2018, Box 83-87

Includes calendar diaries, schedules, and information related to specific events. Specific dates listed with events are often the date of the event, not necessarily the date of all the contents in the folder. Folders are arranged chronologically, with general schedules/events intermingled with individual events.

Subseries 5.5: Speeches, 2001-2017, undated, Box 87-90

Includes speeches given by Moseley Braun and related materials. Floppy disks with various speeches are listed first, then folders are arranged chronologically and identified by the event or topic.

Subseries 5.6: Writings and Publications, 1999-2004, Box 90

Consists of articles written by Moseley Braun and publications by others on a variety of topics such as U.S. Congressional members, Veteran Feminists of America, career success, speeches, and more. Materials are arranged chronologically

Series 6: Personal, 1985-2018, Box 90-91

Contains materials related to Moseley Braun's personal life including handwritten notes, travel documents, photographs, and CDs/DVDs. Includes materials related to her interests, family, associations/membership, travel, and events.

Subseries 6.1: Biographical, 1985-2012, Box 90

Includes handwritten notes, travel documents, association/membership materials, photographs, and CDs/DVDs. Items are arranged chronologically.

Subseries 6.2: Family and Events, 1990-2018, Box 90-91

Contains correspondence, programs, invitations, and materials related to Moseley Braun's family and personal events.

Series 7: Correspondence, 1990-2019, undated, Box 91-95, 128

Includes greeting cards, postcards, letters to/from Moseley Braun, and bulk general and email correspondence. Additional correspondence can be found under Correspondence subseries in other series (Ambassadorship, Presidential Campaign, Mayoral Campaign, etc.), depending on the time period.

Subseries 7.1: General, 1999-2017, undated, Box 91-92

Includes greeting cards, postcards, holiday cards, personal letterhead, contacts, and photographs. Items are arranged chronologically.

Subseries 7.2: Correspondence to Moseley Braun, 1990-2019, undated, Box 93-94

Consists of letters and email correspondence to Moseley Braun. Folders of correspondence from individuals are listed first and arranged alphabetically by the sender. Following the individuals, folders of correspondence from many people are grouped together and arranged chronologically. Some of these folders are identified as general or email correspondence.

Subseries 7.3: Correspondence from Moseley Braun, 1990, 2000-2008, undated, Box 94-95, 128

Includes letters and correspondence from Moseley Braun. Folders of correspondence to individuals are listed first and arranged alphabetically by the recipient. The last two folders in this subseries are general correspondence to a variety of people.

Series 8: Photographs, 1970s-2011, undated, Box 94-102, 119, 125, 127-129,

Contains photographs from Moseley Braun's political, professional, and private life. Also includes negatives, photo contact sheets, slides, 3.5" floppy disks, 5" floppy disk, and CDs. Some photographs are framed and/or autographed. Photos are arranged in chronological order within each subseries.

Subseries 8.1 General, Box 94-101, 119, 125, 128-129, 1970s-2011

Includes photographs from Moseley Braun's political/professional life, headshots, events, campaigns, and with celebrities/prominent officials. Formats include prints, negatives, contact sheets, slides, 3.5" floppy disks, and CDs.

Series 8.2 Personal/Family, Box 101-102, 127, 1970s-2011 [5" floppy disk]

Includes photographs of Moseley Braun's family members, family events, holidays, and personal activities. Formats include prints, a 5" floppy disk, and negatives.

Series 9: Audiovisual, 1993-2006, undated, Box 102-109

Contains CDs, DVDs, videocassettes (majority VHS, one Betamax), audiocassettes, and computer media (zip disk, 3.5" floppy disks, Travan data cartridges). Items are arranged in subseries by format. A number of AV items were digitized by Midwest Productions in January 2024, and this is noted at the item level in the container list below.

Subseries 9.1: CDs/DVDs, 2001-2004, undated, Box 102

Includes materials mostly related to New Zealand, Moseley Braun activities, and music CDs. Items are arranged chronologically.

Subseries 9.2: Video, 1993-2006, undated, Box 103-108

Videocassettes (all VHS tapes except one Betamax) are arranged chronologically. The bulk includes coverage of Moseley Braun's U.S. Presidential campaign and news segments. There are also recordings related to Moseley Braun as a U.S. Senator, programs/specials featuring Moseley Braun, Moseley Braun speaking events, and educational videos related to New Zealand and the environment. Tapes that were digitized by a vendor are noted at the item level in the container list.

Subseries 9.3: Audio, 2003-2004, Box 107

Audiocassettes are arranged chronologically and mostly include interviews with Moseley Braun. Tapes that were digitized by a vendor are noted at the item level in the container list.

Subseries 9.4: Computer Media, 1997-1998, undated, Box 108-109

Most items do not have labels or dates, and they are arranged by media type (zip disk, Travan data cartridges, and 3.5" floppy disks).

Series 10: Memorabilia, 1969-2015, undated, Box 21, 109-130, Flat File, OS unboxed items

This series contains awards received by Braun in the form of trophies, plaques, and certificates. Additional materials include campaign buttons, bumper stickers, banners, pins, scrapbooks, coffee mugs, oversize posters, and other 3-D objects. Many of the items in this series were displayed in Braun's home and professional offices. Most items were removed from frames. Items are boxed by size and intellectually arranged chronologically.

Series 11: Books, 1977-2004, Box 131-132

Includes books owned by Moseley Braun, many of which were gifted and inscribed to her. Books are arranged alphabetically by title.

Series 12: Restricted, Box 13-17A, 133
