Biographical Information

These records reflect the activities of Donna Quinn, OP primarily in her guidance of the Chicago Catholic Women (CCW) from its founding in 1974 to its dissolution in the year 2000. Quinn defined the goal of this organization as “working to promote the full giftedness and personhood of women and a world of justice for all.” She recognized discrimination - gender discrimination - as the root of the injustice and inequality, which enslaves women worldwide.

Born on July 26, 1937, Quinn was the middle child of Catherine and William Quinn. A resident of the south side of Chicago, she attended Visitation High School, conducted by the religious order of the Dominican Sisters of Sinsinawa (OP). In 1955, following graduation, she entered this order,

pronouncing her final vows in 1960. It was that same year that she received her BA degree in Education and History from Edgewood College in Madison, Wisconsin. She continued her formal education earning a MA degree in History from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 1970 and a second MA degree in Administration from the University of Wisconsin in 1974.

In the early years of her religious life, she not only taught math, history and religion, but also served as an administrator in various elementary and secondary Catholic Schools in the Midwest. Around 1975, she enriched her educational offerings by earning a “CPE” Certificate (Clinical Pastoral Education) at Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke’s. With this certificate she joined the faculty of Moraine Valley College teaching Pastoral Care to students entering the medical profession.

Among other causes Quinn espoused: racial equality, reproductive choice, equal rights, lesbian and gay rights, and different faith traditions. As a woman and an avowed feminist, she naturally recognized and challenged the inferior position assigned to women by the Roman Catholic Church. Her resume traces her involvement not only with the Church but also with many diverse groups organized to improve the status of women.

In 1974, she founded and served as the Director of Chicago Catholic Women until its dissolution in 2000. While involved with many women’s causes, Chicago Catholic Women identified the ordination of women as a primary focus. This focus concretized in the founding of the Women’s Ordination Conference in 1976. In 1983, Quinn was instrumental in founding Women’s Church Convergence - a Coalition of thirty national groups. She was also a past president past president of the National Coalition of American Nuns.

In 1984, Quinn was one of nearly one hundred signers to the ad “A Catholic Statement on Pluralism and Abortion” that was published in the *New York Times* on October 7, 1984. The ad was placed by Catholics for a Free Choice (CFFC) and called for dialogue on the issue of abortion.

As a founder, board member, organizer, speaker, and world traveler, Sr. Donna Quinn was a crusader for the “full giftedness and personhood of women” both in the Church and State for decades. Sister Donna Quinn was a member of the Dominican Sisters of Sinsinawa for sixty-four years until her death on July 30, 2021, at St. Dominic Villa, Hazel Green, Wisconsin.

Scope and Content

The Donna Quinn collection spans the years 1975 to 2000 and is arranged alphabetically within each series; the bulk of which relates to organizations with which she worked during this twenty-five-year time span. When the collection was reprocessed in 2008, some series were condensed.

Series 1: General Resource Materials, 1975-2000, undated, Boxes 1-5

This series primarily contains mailings, press releases, programs, and flyers from several organizations and events that relate to women’s issues. The organizations and issues included are Chicago Catholic Women (CCW), National Coalition of American of Nuns (NCAN), Women’s Ordination Conference (WOC), Women Church Convergence (WCC), reproductive rights, Papal visits, the ordination of women, and gay and lesbian rights. They have been arranged alphabetically reflecting the manner in which Donna Quinn arranged them. Update 2008: Many of the folders from this series were integrated with other folders containing papers from the same organization or

issue. The papers from Series 3: Chicago Catholic Women Mailings and Series 4: Chicago Catholic Women Newsletters have been integrated into the Chicago Catholic Women folders in this series. This was done to reduce duplication, create more descriptive folder names, and facilitate proper storage of the papers. All newspaper and magazine articles were removed from the folders in this series and placed in Series 2.

Series 2: News Media, 1975-1998, undated, Boxes 6-7, 22-23

This series contains the articles Quinn collected from newspapers, magazines, and journals, as well as materials related to the ad “A Catholic Statement on Pluralism and Abortion” that was placed in the *New York Times* on October 7, 1984.

Subseries 2.1: General, boxes 6-7

The articles relate to several subjects including abortion, women’s ordination, papal visits, and the place of women in the Catholic Church. The files are arranged alphabetically by subject. Update 2008: This series previously included several articles stored in plastic sheeting from a scrapbook. The articles were removed from the sheeting and the boxes were moved to Series 6 with the other scrapbooks. The remaining contents were reorganized by subject (rather than chronologically) and integrated with the articles removed from Series 1.

Subseries 2.2: New York Times Ad, 1984-1988, Boxes 22-23

Includes materials related to the 1984 ad “A Catholic Statement on Pluralism and Abortion,” which was placed in the *New York Times* on October 7, 1984. Donna Quinn was one of the people who signed the ad. Includes correspondence, reactions/responses, statements, and activities that followed.

Series 3: Scrapbooks, 1994-2000, Boxes 8-10

This series contains the papers from a sign-in guest book and two types of scrapbooks; one on the activities of Chicago Catholic Women and one of newspaper clippings. These papers were kept in plastic sheeting in three-ring binders. They have been removed from the binders and sheeting but left in the order in which they were arranged.

Series 4: Audiovisual Media, 1977-1997, undated, Boxes 10-16

This series contains photographs, audiocassettes, and videocassettes. The audiocassettes contain recordings of sessions at conferences as well as recordings of individuals and events not necessarily occurring at a conference. The videocassettes record events such as Donna Quinn’s news appearance, Cardinal Bernardin’s funeral, CCW luncheons, CCW protests, and the Papal Visit.
