### **Administrative History**

Spurred by a call from the Urban Apostolate of Sisters in Chicago for a center for peace and justice in the city, six Catholic religious communities founded the 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center for Justice in 1974. These six communities included the Sisters of Mercy, Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Dominicans, Adrian Dominicans, Sisters of Providence, and Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The original staff members included Betty Barrett, RSM, Joann Crowley, BVM, Chuck Dahm, OP, Dorothy Gartland, SP, and Beth Wagner, IHM. These founders chose the name 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center for Justice from the biblical concept of the seven days of creation. The "8<sup>th</sup> Day" reflects the belief that creation is still in progress and humans are responsible for shaping their own world.

The founders of 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center envisioned a dual approach to social justice action, directing efforts toward the involved religious communities as well as government and other civic organizations. That focus has expanded to include the media, service organizations, community action groups, and the public in general. Through detailed research of social justice issues and involvement with other social justice and community organizations and groups, 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center raises awareness about these issues and works to enact effective change. 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center directs its actions toward the following vision: "the Spirituality of justice calls the staff of the 8th Day Center to envision a world of right relationships in which all creation is seen as sacred and interconnected. In such a world all people are equal and free from oppression, have a right to a just distribution of resources, and to live in harmony with the cosmos."

In its first year, 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center chose to focus its social justice efforts on hunger concerns in Chicago. These efforts resulted in the Food Stamp Hotline, the Chicago Metropolitan Food Stamp Coalition, the Conference on Hunger, and the Chicago Summer Program. The organization then widened its coverage to include issues of corporate responsibility, economic justice, human rights, peace, and women. During the 1980s, much of the center's efforts focused on Central America and resisting the military build-up of the Reagan administration. In the 1990s, concern for the United

States' interventionist policies shifted from military to economic intervention in other countries. With the onset of the Persian Gulf War, attention began to move away from Central America and toward the Middle East, while economic and human rights concerns continued to remain a high priority. In 2009, 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center has focus groups for environmental degradation, globalization, militarization, and racism. The center also continues to sponsor its annual Good Friday Walk for Justice and Urban Plunge program, which it began in 1980 and 1977 respectively. 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center continues to adjust its efforts to reflect the needs of the society it serves in an effort to bring about peace and justice in Chicago and the world.

## **Scope and Content**

The 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center for Justice Records consist of materials related to the organization's social justice activism in the Chicago area, spanning from 1968 until 2009. The records contain administrative and program materials, flyers and posters, news articles, research files, newsletters and publications, and conference materials. This collection also contains a large audio/visual component consisting of photographs, slides, audio tapes, and video tapes, as well as memorabilia items and oversize posters. The items are arranged alphabetically within series.

#### Series 1: Administrative Records, 1968-2009, n.d., Boxes 1-21

This series contains the administrative records related to 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center's peace and justice efforts. Materials include newsletters and publications, conference materials, brochures, committee materials, program and program planning materials, staff notes and meeting minutes, and correspondence.

#### Series 2: Research Files, 1970-2008, n.d., Boxes 21-37

This series consists of research files pertaining to 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center's various social justice concerns. The two largest components are the materials related to Central America and women. The items in this series include publications produced by other organizations, correspondence, newsletters, news articles, and reports. Some of the documents regarding Central America are written in Spanish.

#### Series 3: Audio/Visual Materials, 1973-2004, n.d., Boxes 38-42

This series contains the audio/visual materials of the collection. The items are divided by their format, consisting of photographs, slides, audio tapes, and video tapes and arranged alphabetically. The materials primarily relate to programs and demonstrations sponsored by 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center.

#### Series 4: Memorabilia, 1976-2004, n.d., Boxes 43-48

This series contains the memorabilia objects of the collection. Materials include buttons, cloth banners, scrapbooks, a cloth bag, and two woven bracelets. The objects were used in 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center programs and demonstrations. The scrapbooks detail 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center's publicity in local newspapers and a conference on defense technology in 1979.

#### Series 5: Oversize, 1983-2007, n.d., Box 49

This series contains the oversize posters of the collection. Some posters were professionally produced by outside organizations while others were handmade by 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center staff and volunteers. The posters relate to 8<sup>th</sup> Day Center's social justice concerns and the organization's own demonstrations and programs.
