Biographical History

Linda Lewis Kramer was born in 1937 and grew up in Coronado, California where her parents ran an art school. She graduated with a BA from Scripps College in California in 1959 and then moved to Chicago, where she earned an M.F.A from the School of the Art Institute in Chicago in 1981. As a ceramicist and later, a painter, Kramer has had numerous exhibitions and her art has been featured in various locales, especially Chicago. She also helped found the Midwest Clay Guild in Evanston and Chicago's Artemisia Gallery. Kramer has three daughters and currently resides in Winnetka, IL.
