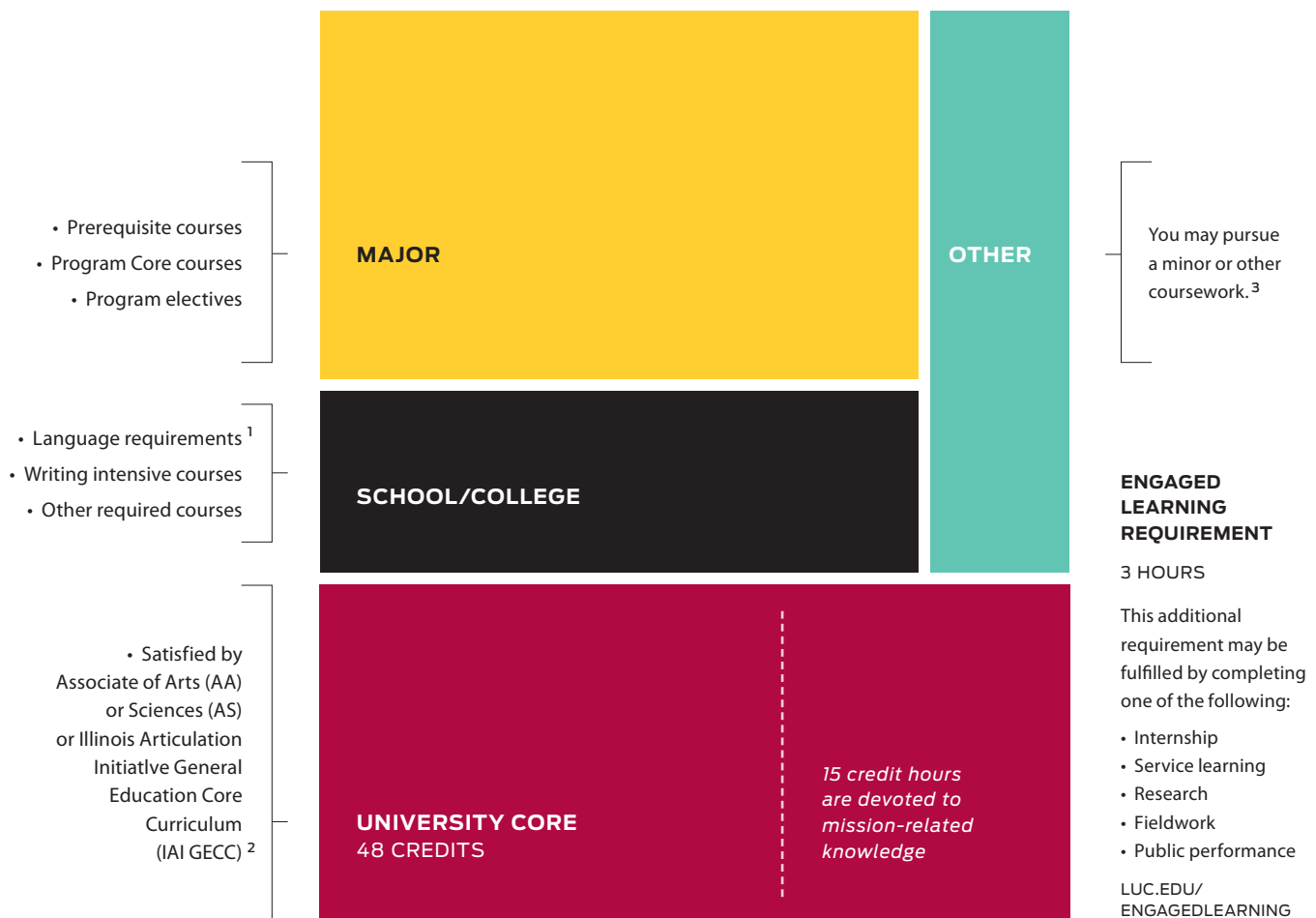

### NOTES

<sup>1</sup> Majors in arts, sciences, communications, environmental studies, and international business require the completion of non-English language courses up to the 120 level or transfer credit.

<sup>2</sup> Other associate's degrees, including in Applied Sciences (AAS), may fulfill some Core requirements.

<sup>3</sup> Some students need elective classes to reach the 120 credit hours required to earn a bachelor's degree. An optional minor concentration and/or other coursework (i.e. pre-health requirements) can increase requirements by a semester or more.

# FULFILLING THE UNIVERSITY'S CORE REQUIREMENT

Transfer students without associate's degrees can satisfy the University Core in two ways. Most will be guided by Loyola's Core curriculum, although students entering with a high number of credit hours may follow Illinois' general education standard and take additional mission-related courses.
